Academic OneFile **FULL TEXT**

Provides the full-text of 6,300 titles, with coverage from 1980 to the present. Every article in this database can be translated into 8 different languages.

★ **Academic Search Complete** **FULL TEXT** ★

Designed specifically for academic institutions, this is the world's largest scholarly, multi-disciplinary database, containing full text for 5,300 periodicals, including 4,400 peer-reviewed journals. Updated daily.

ArticleFirst via FirstSearch

Used to find articles on specific topics within print publications available at the CFCC Library, or for InterLibrary Loan requests for articles not in LINCCWeb.

Expanded Academic ASAP **FULL TEXT**

Provides the full-text of 2,100 titles in all disciplines, from 1980 to the present.

Funk and Wagnalls New World Encyclopedia **FULL TEXT**

Contains over 25,000 records, covering a wide range of topics.

General OneFile **FULL TEXT**

Includes more than 4,200 full-text titles from 1980 to the present.

General Reference Center Gold **FULL TEXT**

Includes encyclopedias, newspaper articles, and 1,200 full text periodical titles.

JSTOR **FULL TEXT**

Provides the full text of back issues of 700 core journals in the humanities, social sciences, and sciences, some dating as far back as the 1600s.

New York Times—Historical **FULL TEXT**

Full-text and full-image articles for The New York Times, from 1851-2003.

OmniFile Full Text Mega Edition **FULL TEXT**

Provides access to the full text of articles from over 1,750 publications.

Readers Guide Full Text **FULL TEXT**

Provides current events coverage in popular periodicals.

WorldCat via FirstSearch

Used for InterLibrary Loan requests for books not available in LINCCWeb.



DATABASES

These databases provide the full text of articles that were originally published in magazines, journals, and newspapers.

They are available to currently enrolled Florida community college students, anywhere those students can access the Internet.



GETTING THERE

Go to LINCCWeb at **www.linccweb.org**. Click **Search a Specific Database**, then:

- ◆ Pick **Central Florida Community College**
- ◆ Enter your 9-digit **Borrower ID** and your **PIN** (last 4 digits of your ID)
- ◆ At the next screen, select **General**
- ◆ Select a database

LINCCWeb Databases

There are 80+ LINCCWeb databases, most of which provide the full text of at least some of the articles indexed in the database. "Full text" means that you can view the complete article, not just a summary or information about the article. You can also, in most databases, print articles, save them to disk or flash drive, or email them.

The full-text articles that you access through the LINCCWeb databases are the exact same articles that were published in the original print version of the magazine or journal or newspaper or reference book, so that is how they are categorized for research papers. LINCCWeb articles are not web sites; they are magazine or journal articles or reference book essays.

Not every database provides full-text articles, so it's important to choose a database that does provide full-text if you need the actual articles. In the list of databases, the ones that provide actual articles say **Full Text** next to the title. In addition, usually not every record, even in a full text database, is attached to a full text article. If you need articles, most databases offer the option of limiting your search to Full Text. This is generally a good idea.

If you have trouble connecting to the LINCCWeb databases from home, see the Database Connection Help Sheet at www.cf.edu/departments/instruction/lrc/connection.htm.



In the list of retrieved articles in certain databases, a **Find Text?** button or a LINCCWeb SFX link is available. This can be used to locate the full text of the article, if unavailable in the database being used. Click on the link, and, in the new window that opens, it may say **View Full Text available via:** with a list of other LINCCWeb databases. Click on any of these other databases, and the full text of that article may be available in the new window that appears.
