CQ Researcher **FULL TEXT**

Explores a controversial issue each week, and publishes 44 reports each year.

Criminal Justice Periodicals Index **FULL TEXT**

Provides the full text, including images, of 50 criminal justice journals.

Daily Life Online **FULL TEXT**

Provides a context for contemporary life and culture with a comprehensive resource that supports history, social studies, English, and language students.

History Reference Center **FULL TEXT**

Offers full text from 750 history reference books and 60 history magazines. Contains 58,000 documents; 43,000 biographies; 12,000 photos and maps.

Issues and Controversies **FULL TEXT**

Current information on 600+ controversial research topics including overviews, timelines, statistics, key news events, and selected historical source documents.

JSTOR **FULL TEXT**

Provides the full text of back issues of 700 core journals in the humanities, social sciences, and sciences, some dating as far back as the 1600s.

Legal Periodicals & Books **FULL TEXT**

International coverage and access to legal journals and books.

Military and Government Collection **FULL TEXT**

A thorough collection of military titles, including full text for 350 titles.

Opposing Viewpoints Resource Center **FULL TEXT**

Find full-text viewpoint articles, topic overviews, statistics, and newspaper and magazine articles concerning social issues.

PsycArticles **FULL TEXT**

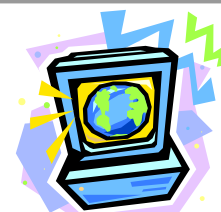
Provides full-text, scholarly and scientific psychology articles from 56 journals.

Readers Guide Full Text **FULL TEXT**

Covers popular periodical resources, with select full text from 1994 on.

Social Sciences Full Text **FULL TEXT**

Covers the latest concepts, theories, and methods from the social sciences, with select full text from 1994 on.



DATABASES

These databases provide the full text of articles that were originally published in magazines, journals, and newspapers.

They are available to currently enrolled Florida community college students, anywhere those students can access the Internet.

GETTING THERE

Go to LINCCWeb at **www.linccweb.org**. Click **Search a Specific Database**, then:

- ◆ Pick **Central Florida Community College**
- ◆ Enter your 9-digit **Borrower ID** and your **PIN** (last 4 digits of your ID)
- ◆ At the next screen, select the **Social Sciences** topic area
- ◆ Select a database, then click **Connect to Database**

LINCCWeb Databases

There are 80+ LINCCWeb databases, most of which provide the full text of at least some of the articles indexed in the database. "Full text" means that you can view the complete article, not just information about the article. You can also, in most databases, print articles, save them to a flash drive, or email them.

The full-text articles that you access through the LINCCWeb databases are the exact same articles that were published in the original print version of the magazine or journal or newspaper or reference book, so that is how they are categorized for research papers. LINCCWeb articles are not web sites; they are magazine or journal articles or reference book essays.

Not every database provides full-text articles, so it's important to choose a database that does provide full-text if you need the actual articles. In the list of databases, the ones that provide actual articles say **Full Text** next to the title. In addition, usually not every record, even in a full text database, is attached to a full text article. If you need articles, most databases offer the option of limiting your search to Full Text. This is generally a good idea.
